Support the green and digital transitions,





Capacity building for higher education

- 2-3 year Partnerships of HEIs from EU MS & associated third countries and nonassociated third countries.
- Lump sums
- Three types of project
 - FOSTERING ACCESS TO COOPERATION IN HE (24-36 months):
 - > smaller scope projects focused on universities & LDCs priority to newcomers €200-400k
 - **PARTNERSHIPS FOR INNOVATION IN HE** (24-36 months):
 - For the second seco
 - STRUCTURAL REFORM PROJECTS (36-48 months)
 - Focus on policy reforms require involvement of ministries € 800-1000k



Closer alignment of European international cooperation actions with the EU priorities

Overarching priorities

- Smart: digital technology in the poorest countries by building foundations for digital skills, digital transformation and data technologies
- **Green deal:** including climate change, environment and energy; enabling a profound change in institutions and peoples' behaviour and skills.
- **Growth & Jobs:** foundational skills, 'soft' skills (e.g. problem solving, communication), and Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Maths (STEAM). Education and employability
- Inclusion and diversity: making education systems themselves more equitable.
- Values: laying the foundations for strengthening active citizenship and building specific expertise of future policymakers in areas such as democracy, human rights and multilateralism
- **External policy priorities:** governance, peace and security, migration partnerships, SDGs



Capacity building for higher education

• Priorities:

- National only for Strand 3
- Regional: overarching; regional targets


Geographical targets for the following regions

- For Eastern Partnership countries: for Strands 1 and 2 priority will be given to HEIs from non-capital and/or rural and/or more remote regions;
- For Asia, Central Asia, Middle East and Pacific: For Strands 1 and 2 priority will be given to least developed countries;
- For Sub-Sahara Africa: For all Strands 1 and 2 Priority will be given to the least developed countries; a special emphasis shall also be put on migration priority countries and on regional projects involving HEIs from several countries; no country will access more than 8% of funding foreseen for the Region;
